3. Time Calculators

These tools answer time-based questions — how long between two moments, how old something is, how many hours someone worked.

Time Between Dates

Calculates the precise duration between two dates, expressed in years, months, days, hours, minutes, and seconds.

Example: From 2025-01-15 09:00 to 2026-03-20 17:30 = 1 year, 2 months, 5 days, 8 hours, 30 minutes.

Time Between Times

Computes the elapsed time between two clock times on the same or different days.

Example: From 22:30 Monday to 06:15 Tuesday = 7 hours, 45 minutes.

Add Time Calculator

Adds a duration (hours, minutes, seconds) to a starting date-time and returns the resulting moment.

Example: 2026-06-09 14:00 + 36 hours = 2026-06-11 02:00.

Subtract Time Calculator

Subtracts a duration from a starting date-time.

Example: 2026-12-25 09:00 minus 200 hours = 2026-12-16 17:00.

Duration Calculator

Aggregates multiple time spans into a total duration — useful for invoicing and time tracking.

Example: 1h 45m + 2h 30m + 3h 15m = 7h 30m.

Countdown Tools

Shows the remaining time until a future date or event, updated live.

Example: Days until Christmas, New Year, Easter, Halloween, Diwali, or a custom event.

Age Calculator

Computes exact age in years, months, days, hours, minutes, and seconds from a birthdate.

Example: Born 1990-04-12 → age 36 years, 1 month, 28 days (as of 2026-06-09).

Work Hours Calculator

Calculates total work hours including breaks, overtime, and shift differentials.

Example: 9:00–17:00 with a 30-minute lunch = 7.5 paid hours.

Time Zone Tools

Convert any time to any other zone, see DST status, and pick meeting times that work for distributed teams.

Example: 10:00 New York → 15:00 London (winter) or 14:00 London (DST).

4. Date Calculators

Date Difference Calculator

Returns the number of days, weeks, months, and years between two calendar dates.

Example: From 2024-01-01 to 2026-06-09 = 890 days, 127 weeks 1 day.

Add Days Calculator

Adds a number of days to a date.

Example: 2026-06-09 + 90 days = 2026-09-07.

Subtract Days Calculator

Subtracts a number of days from a date.

Example: 2026-12-31 minus 30 days = 2026-12-01.

Business Days Calculator

Counts working days only, skipping weekends and (optionally) holidays.

Example: From 2026-06-01 to 2026-06-30 = 22 business days.

Working Days Calculator

Like business days, but supports custom workweeks (e.g. Sun–Thu in the Gulf region).

Example: Sun–Thu workweek, 2026-06-01 → 2026-06-15 = 11 working days.

Future Date Calculator

Finds a date a given number of days, weeks, months, or years in the future.

Example: Today + 18 months = 2027-12-09.

Past Date Calculator

Finds a date a given period in the past.

Example: Today minus 5 years = 2021-06-09.

5. Time Zone Features

World Time Lookup

Instantly see the current time in any city in the world, with DST applied automatically.

Example: Search 'Singapore' → 21:42 SGT, +12h from EST.

Time Zone Converter

Convert between any two zones at any specific time and date.

Example: Convert 2026-09-14 10:00 New York to Tokyo = 23:00 same day Tokyo.

Meeting Planner

Finds overlapping working hours across 2–10 participants in different time zones and highlights fair meeting windows.

Example: NY + London + Bangalore: best overlap is 09:00–11:30 NY / 14:00–16:30 LON / 18:30–21:00 BLR.

International Scheduling Tools

Per-city hub pages (e.g. /cities/london) include business-hour overlaps, popular city comparisons, travel tips, and scheduling recommendations.

Example: /cities/tokyo shows overlap windows with NY, SF, London, Sydney, and Singapore.

6. Planning & Productivity Features

Project Deadline Planner

Reverse-plan from a delivery date to milestones, factoring in business days only.

Example: Launch 2026-09-30 → milestone QA must begin by 2026-09-09.

Shift Scheduler

Build rotating shifts with coverage gaps highlighted.

Example: 3-person 24/7 coverage rotates every 8 hours.

SLA Timer

Tracks service-level commitments against business hours and pauses outside them.

Example: 4-hour SLA started Friday 16:00 → due Monday 11:00 (skipping weekend).

Invoice Due Date Calculator

Calculates payment due dates from issue date and Net terms.

Example: Issued 2026-06-09, Net 30 = due 2026-07-09.

Recurring Billing Planner

Schedules recurring invoices on monthly, quarterly, or annual cadences with end-of-month handling.

Example: Monthly on the 31st → 28/29/30 in shorter months.

Team Meeting Scheduler

Group meeting finder for remote teams across multiple zones with fairness rotation.

Example: Quarterly rotation puts the burden of late-night calls on different regions each cycle.

Calendar & Week Number Utilities

Look up ISO week numbers, identify leap years, and inspect any month.

Example: Week 24 of 2026 is 2026-06-08 to 2026-06-14.

Holiday Countdowns

Pre-built countdowns to Christmas, New Year, Halloween, Easter, Diwali, and more.

Example: Days until Christmas updates live.

7. Saved Results & User Features

DateAndTimePro offers an optional account so you can save calculations, alerts, and team schedules across devices.

Account creation

- Sign up at /signup with email or Google
- Verify your email (when required by your region)
- No account is required for any free calculator

Login

- Sign in at /login

8. Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Is DateAndTimePro free to use?

A: Yes. All core calculators are free and supported by lightweight ads. A Pro plan removes ads and unlocks advanced features.

Q: Do I need an account?

A: No. Every calculator works without signing in. An account only helps if you want to save calculations across devices.

Q: Does it handle Daylight Saving Time?

A: Yes. Every time-zone tool is DST-aware and uses the IANA time-zone database.

Q: How accurate are the calculations?

A: All math runs in your browser using exact arithmetic on UTC timestamps — results are accurate to the second.

Q: Can I embed widgets on my site?

A: Yes. Visit </widgets> to configure embeddable world clocks, countdowns, converters, and business-day calculators.

Q: Are my calculations private?

A: Yes. Calculations run client-side. We don't transmit your inputs to a server unless you explicitly save them to an account.

Q: How do I plan a meeting across many time zones?

A: Use the Meeting Planner at </team-meeting-scheduler> or visit </cities/{city}> for per-city overlap tables.

Q: What's the difference between business days and working days?

A: Business days are Monday–Friday with US/EU defaults. Working days let you define your own workweek and holidays.

Q: Can I copy or share my results?

A: Yes. Every calculator has Copy and Share buttons that produce plain-text results and shareable links.

Q: Do you support recurring events?

A: Yes. The countdown, billing, and meeting tools all support recurring rules.

Q: Why does my time look different than my colleague's?

A: Each visitor sees their local time. The meeting planner shows everyone's local time side-by-side.

Q: Can I print the results?

A: Yes. Every calculator page is print-friendly. Use your browser's print dialog (Ctrl/Cmd + P).

Q: Does the site work on mobile?

Time management

- Track actual hours with the Work Hours Calculator before estimating new projects

Scheduling best practices

- Always pick meeting times in UTC first, then render in each attendee's local zone
- Rotate the burden of inconvenient hours across regions every quarter
- Default to async; meetings are for decisions, design reviews, and unblocking
- Reserve 25- or 50-minute slots to leave breathing room between calls

International meeting planning

- Identify the overlap window first; pick the meeting time inside it second
- Watch for DST transitions in March/April and October/November
- Use per-city hubs (/cities/{city}) for context on local working hours and holidays
- For teams spanning more than 9 hours, prefer async with a rotating live call

Productivity suggestions

- Use the Business Days Calculator before quoting any delivery date
- Set SLA timers for any client commitment with a deadline
- Plan invoice due dates the moment you ship — not at month end
- Review the workdays-left-in-the-year page each quarter to plan capacity

10. Privacy & Security

DateAndTimePro is privacy-first by design.

User privacy

- No tracking pixels, no behavioral profiling, no third-party analytics on calculator inputs
